She knew, however, that Gloucester wasn't a central enough location to serve a variety of patients. In 2005, she signed a lease for a 300-square-foot office and began her speech therapy practice here. Melanie was

Over the course of 12 years, Speech Therapy Group has expanded into more than 3,700 square feet and now has 10 speech pathologists and six administrative staff working out of its space.
